

CREATE YOUR OWN CHARACTER!




BRING YOUR CHARACTER TO LIFE!

Writing tips!

- Base your characters on people you know or see in films and TV. It's easier to have them be a combination of people rather than create them from scratch!
- Think about how certain parts of your character's personality will affect how they are. If for instant they like fair play on the pitch, they are likely to also be angry with those who break the rules.
- When writing a full story involving your character, you don't have to start from the beginning. Write the parts that interest you first, then build your story around those moments.




PUT YOUR CHARACTER IN A STORY!




